Heat with Heart

Smile Farms serves up hot sauce

After an abundance of peppers were grown at Smile Farms, employees decided on the perfect solution: making, jarring, and selling hot sauce!

The Heat with Heart hot sauce is composed of peppers grown by the Smile farmers with different abilities. On sale now are the fiery red and earthy green sauces, made with hot and sweet peppers, grown across six Smile Farms campus locations.

They plant many varieties of hot peppers like Krimzon Lee, Helio Habanero, and Hungarian Hot Wax, and sweet ones like Escamillo and Roulette. Rather than contracting a fulfillment center, Smile Farm employs six individuals with developmental disabilities, who pack and ship their bottled hot sauce.

At the farms, over 250 farmers get educational, vocational, and paid employment opportunities from the pepper project. Last year, Smile farmers harvested over 2,000 pounds of peppers, bottling over 6,000 hot sauces.

"We're also excited to share our new relationship with Upstream Hospitality. Smile farmers grow and supply cilantro, basil, and other herbs for their restaurant, The Tap Room Patchogue, to use in their cocktails and tacos," said a Smile Farms spokesperson. "Currently in its pilot phase, the program is expected to expand to include additional vegetables and herbs from Smile Farms throughout the summer and beyond."

The story of Smile Farms dates back to 2015 when the founder of 1-800-Flowers, Jim McCann, took a call from IGHL founder Walter Stockton. Together they began to make a world where adults with developmental disabilities and their communities could work.

McCann's brother, Kevin, lived at the Moriches Independent Group Living—a residence for people with developmental disabilities—where the idea came to help residents like Kevin to flourish with meaningful jobs.

Later that year, the duo partnered with IGHL to open their first Smile Farms campus. Since then, the farm has become a nonprofit leader for agricultural jobs for adults with disabilities.

"For the first time ever, they are able to experience the satisfaction of mastering new skills, the pleasure of contributing to their team and community, and the thrill of taking home a paycheck," the

Back to school at Center Moriches



The Center Moriches 2022-23 school year will start on Tuesday, Sept. 6.

"We are eagerly looking forward to welcoming back our students and teachers to the 2022-2023 school year," said superintendent of schools Dr. Ronald M. Masera. "It

has been a busy summer hiring new staff and getting our facilities ready for the new year."

The district welcomes new teachers and staff, including a new high school assistant principal, Katy Forman. This vear, work will be done with an Energy Performance Contract (EPC) throughout the district. The district will also receive new lighting and energy efficiencies, which, according to Masera, will save taxpayers money and help support a reduced carbon footprint moving forward. Additionally, the high school and main street gym floors are being resur-

He also said that this year, they will be applying for Primary Years Programme (PYP) authorization through International Baccalaureate (IB) at Clayton Huey.

"We will soon be the first public school in New York State that is fully IB K-12 with the Middle Years Programme (MYP) in our middle school and the Diploma Programme (DP0) at our high school," he said. "We also will be graduating students this coming year with the Seal of Civic Readiness. This is a new credential being offered through New York State Education Department and we have already

been approved to offer it. Because of our involvement with IB and our commitment to community service projects, we anticipate all of our graduating seniors will be eligible for this credential. "

The high school has also recently been recognized by NYS Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) as a School of Excellence.

"All in all, there are many wonderful things to celebrate in our Center Moriches schools," he added.

Opening access to health care resources

Library and Stony Brook Medicine partner

The Center Moriches Free Public Library has recently partnered with the Public Libraries of Suffolk County to release the Stony Brook Medicine Healthy Libraries Program (SBMHeLP).

The program allows a unique group of health care professionals and graduate-student interns from the fields of social work, public health, nursing, nutrition, and library science to work together to provide access to both in-person and virtual health care-related resources for public library patrons throughout Suffolk County.

The partnership, library director Marcie Litjens explained, seeks to enhance the health and well-being of Suffolk County residents through library programming, collection development, and dissemination of information on current health topics impacting the community. The program is supported in part by the American Heart Association of Long Island.

The healthy library program is basically meant to provide resources that can enhance the health and well-being in the community," said Valerie Lewis, liaison for Suffolk County Libraries. "The main goal was to really impact people's health by checking their blood pressure and teaching people how to do self-mon-

However, she noted that the program is not meant to substitute visiting a medical physician, but rather to help empower patrons to self-monitor their health.

"It's a very wonderful program," she added.

The program will relaunch this fall in Center Moriches for the second year in a row as one of only eight libraries in Suffolk County. Last year, Litjens said, the program was very successful.

"The Healthy Libraries Program will be back at our library this fall," said


On Sept.20, Oct. 4, Oct. 18 and Nov. 1, from 2 to 4:30 p.m., interns from the HeLP program will be available at the CM Library for more information. No appointment is necessary and all are welcome.

"We were also part of the pilot program to circulate blood pressure cuffs to the public," Litjens said, proud of their offerings. "This program proved to be very successful and is now expanded to other Suffolk County libraries.

The library will also be hosting their fourth social worker intern this fall. Miranda, the intern, will be available beginning mid-September, every Tuesday and Thursday between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m., to assist with emergency shelter, family matters, and food assistance. Intern with Stony Brook Medicine Healthy Libraries Program

Students will be placed in public libraries (virtually) as a public health intern as part of an interdisciplinary team. The student would be investigating what the needs of patrons are in reference to the social and behavioral determinants of health, preparing educational materials, and assisting with learning outcome assessments. The team consists of nursing, social work, public health, and library science students. The team works together to address public library patrons' needs by offering health information, referrals to social service providers, and case management. Students will be responsible for gathering resources and creating presentations,

partaking in trainings, and assessment activities. The internship could develop into a practicum, but that is not required for participation.

Public health students will be superised by Dr. Benz Scott, MPH program director. Interested students must be available during the day hours on Tuesdays in order to participate with the team on fieldwork days (virtually).



Remembering Chet Wilcox

Longtime Center Moriches resident dies at 80

Family and friends gathered at Rockhill Country Club, in Manorville, on Saturday, July 30, to remember the late Chester (Chet) Harvey Wilcox III, a longtime Center Moriches resident and business owner, who died on May 3 at the age of 80.

Born July 21, 1941, Wilcox was a third-generation Wilcox who called Center Moriches home for more than 50 years. His family moved to the hamlet from Vermont in the late 1800s, when they learned that the railroad was extending farther east to Center Moriches. Seeing it as an opportunity, the Wilcoxes settled in the hamlet, where they made their living in duck farming, operating farms on Old Neck Road (now the Wilcox Farms housing development) for decades.

Wilcox worked on the farm during most of his childhood and young adult life, but in 1962, joined the United States Airforce, said his daughter, Margaret (Meg) Wilcox. While enlisted, Wilcox studied to become a weatherman and was stationed in French Frigate Shoals, an Island in the South Pacific.

While Wilcox grew up fishing, it's in the South Pacific where he found his true passion for the sport, said Meg. There, he became acquainted with species of fish he'd never encountered before in the waters of Long Island. In fact, his time in the South Pacific became a bit of a family joke, said his nephew, Barry Wilcox, who quipped that while Uncle Chet was fishing in the South Pacific, his father, Chet's brother, was stationed in Vietnam.

After completing his tour of duty, Wilcox returned to Center Moriches to again work at the duck farm. Soon, however, he decided that he wanted to go to college, which is where he met his wife, Margaret, Meg said. They married and decided to stay in Center Moriches to start their family. As time went on, the Wilcox family saw the decline of the duck farming industry, and eventually made the decision to get out of the business. But first, Wilcox made a move that married his love of fishing to his livelihood, when he found himself purchasing a store on Main Street, B&B. The "Bs" stood for Benny's Bait and Barbershop, where in the mid-1960s, one could pick up a new fishing lure after getting a fresh shave. Wilcox didn't continue the barber services, but instead, focused on the bait and tackle aspect.

In the early years of owning B&B, Wilcox employed his father, an important fixture in the store, who rarely took a day off.

Wilcox's B&B Tackle Shop became a focal point for the fishing community in Center Moriches and surrounding hamlets, where fishermen could get more than bait and fishing line. Wilcox always had the most up-to-date fishing reports and tips on the best places to fish on any given

This vast knowledge of local fishing is how the infamous "breakfast club" was born, said Doug Kaloski, one of the original members. Wilcox and Kaloski fostered a special friendship that spanned more than 50 years, thanks to their many shared experiences, like owning duck farms and fishing.

Kaloski recalled how it all began, when he stopped by the tackle shop on his way home from work as a truck driver one morning. It was about 5 a.m., and Kaloski decided to pop in and see Wilcox to catch up on the fishing report. Soon afterward, Kaloski's cousin, Joe Gregory, seeing Kaloski's truck in front of the shop, stopped in, and then another local friend and fisherman, John Bunai. Wilcox's best friend and employee, Ronnie Lamiroult, would join in the conversation as well. The "breakfast club" would see members come and go over the years, but the core members remained, and while they almost always talked about fishing, they also "cured the ills of the world," said

Wilcox memorialized this special group of fishermen with a polaroid camera, which he usually used to take photos of customers with their catch. "He wanted to have a picture of the 'breakfast club' members so that when we were no longer there, he would always have a picture to remember us by. That picture is taped to the inside corner of the display case,' Kaloski said.

As much of an avid fisherman that he was, Wilcox never owned a boat, said Meg, but instead, fished from other people's boats or from the beach. She also said that her father almost never killed any fish, but instead would tag and release them back into the water, so that marine biologists could study the fish. Wilcox also didn't eat seafood.

His greatest pleasure came from sharing his love of fishing with others, especially children, which is why, for years, he organized an annual snapper derby at Union Dock; the coveted prize was a new bike, which every kid wanted, noted Barry. He also donated fishing poles and equipment to those less fortunate.
"Uncle Chet would do whatever he

could do to let others catch fish. He got his most joy when he could tell people where to fish," Barry said.

Wilcox had a positive and important impact on countless fishermen over the years, including the late Joseph Rera, a Center Moriches teenager who perished in a fishing accident in November 2020. Joe, too, was an avid fisherman and a frequent visitor to B&B Tackle, said his father, Derek Rera. He described Wilcox as "very generous," especially when it came to supplying his son with bait.

"Chet was always happy to help fishermen with how and where to try and catch the fish of their dreams, and even tell you a good joke or two," said William Jakob, of the Montauk Surfcasters Association.

'He was loved by everyone," said Meg. "He was very ethical and never took advantage of anyone.'

"He was a pillar of the community, and a piece of that community will be forever missed," added Barry.

Family blends cheesesteaks with homemade Italian eats

Espo's Cheesesteak Factory serves up at local market

Although his family legacy is rooted in the restaurant industry, Antonio Esposito himself never desired to open one of his own. That was until he made cheesesteaks at his daughter Mia's 6th birthday party this past May.

"I just wanted to see everybody's face, how they'd react," Esposito said of his party offerings. "I couldn't make them fast enough. I put the sternos up, I was ready to put the sandwiches on, but every time I made one, it was gone. I couldn't even eat one that day.'

"People were surrounding him to make those cheesesteaks," Mascia Esposito, his wife, added. "That inspired him."

Two weeks later, the couple popped up a tent in Calverton, grilled some thin-cut rib eye, and served cheesesteaks. They also began cooking their fresh eats at the Moriches Artisan Markets every Sunday at the New Amsterdam Nursery. As the weeks went by and the word spread in Center Moriches, the couple decided to dedicate their whole week to the nursery.

For three months, the couple, alongside their middle child, Alessio Esposito, and his friends, ran their tent. The operation is currently on pause, but for good reason: the Espositos are securing two food trucks. They await inspections and approvals to have one permanently

stationed at the nursery, which Antonio Espositio said should be completed within the coming weeks. The other will make appearances at street fairs and

"I never thought about opening up a truck," Antonio Esposito said. "It just happened. I honestly did not have a plan. I'm so overwhelmed, excited, and nervous at the same time because it got so big, so quick."

The Espo's Cheesesteak Factory menu boasts an array of classic and unique cheesesteaks. Customers can order a traditional cheesesteak with onions, mayo and white American, provolone or mozzarella cheese, and top it off with mushrooms, peppers, and hot cherry peppers.

There's also the pizza steak, slathered in pizza sauce and mozzarella cheese, plus pepperoni for those who want the works.

The couple even incorporate some of their family favorites on their rotating list of specialty items. For their son, they serve Alessio's Chopped Cheese, with colby jack, lettuce and tomato; and for their daughter, they craft the Mia's Choice, balsamic-marinated grilled chicken topped with onion, mushrooms, fire-roasted red peppers, provolone, lettuce, tomato and a balsamic reduction.

The specialty menu even featured a bacon, egg, and cheesesteak as well as a broccoli rabe cheesesteak and a chicken alla vodka sandwich.

"It's all handmade, homemade, wholesome goodness that we eat at home and I want to share to the world," Antonio Esposito said. "I don't want anybody to be excluded from what we normally have as Italians at home."

Born in Monte di Procida, in Italy, Mascia Esposito now shares traditional dishes she made her whole life at home with her legions of customers. She created a fan favorite with The Sunday sandwich: her tender homemade meatballs smashed on the grill, topped with her savory Sunday dinner sauce, mozzarella and parmesan, and served on a brioche

"There are so many ideas we have, and obviously, we have a limit on preparing things; that's why we created the specials of the day," Mascia Esposito said. "We have so many other things that we want to come up with that we made at home growing up with my childhood experiences.

We already have so many regulars here," she continued. "The way they're walking towards us with a smile like they've known us for who knows how long, it's wonderful; it makes you feel good about what you're doing. You get to know these people; it's very fulfilling.'

pet and walk the dogs, hold them on the swings, and even take some up the playground equipment and down the slide.

"It's great for her to deal with different people, and it's also wonderful for the kids," Penny's owner, John Beck, said. "It's a win-win, and the more she socializes, she's well-mannered. I started bringing her out as soon as I could."

He and the other veterans with Paws of War, who dedicated their lives to service in the armed forces, continue their steadfast duty to serve in civilian life. This includes reaching out to all members of the community to make new human and animal friends.

"It gives an opportunity for our veterans and first responders and other volunteers to give back," Kelli Porti, the veteran and community outreach liaison for Paws of War, said. "We're about service and giving back to the community."

Some of the veterans enjoy bringing their therapy and service animals around to anyone who could benefit from some positive puppy playtime.

"I try making it every week," veteran Barry O'Rourke said, his Australian labradoodle Lucy at his side. "I just love giving back and bringing her to camp. This morning we were at an assisted living facility, and then we came here.'

Aside from their cute and cuddly nature, the veterans' dogs provide a unique unspoken benefit for the campers at Camp Pa-Qua-Tuck.

"A lot of our campers—[about] 75 percent of our population here—are autistic, and some of them don't have the ability to convey their feelings or emotions," Melissa Locrotondo, Camp Pa-Qua-Tuck's chief of programming and aquatics director, said. "And when they are around dogs, they don't have to speak or express their emotions because the dogs just feel it. And then our campers that are verbal and are able to speak and stand up for themselves, they just are able to express how much they love seeing them here on campus.

Prior to the Paws of War visits last summer, Locrotondo said the campers previously experienced interacting with dogs, or rather a dog: Spencer. Director Alyssa Pecorino's pup resides on the campgrounds with her, and the campers have enjoyed his company. Based on those connections, the camp invited the service animals, who were met with the open arms of not only the campers, but the staff as well.

"They're pretty much a staple of the camp," Pecorino said of the Paws of War dogs. "They come every single week and the effect that they have on the campers and the staff has been tremendous, especially with our international staff here. After COVID, after everything that's happened... it's made them feel at home."

"I've seen so many campers who were terrified of dogs who are now interacting with them," she continued. "They're able to do it in a safe space. It's been amazing, the transformation.'

Peconic Bay receives four-star CMS rating

Peconic Bay Medical Center in Riverhead recently received a four-star CMS rating, a great accomplishment that puts the center in the upper echelons of care.

According to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, based on July 2022 results, 28.67 percent of hospitals received a four-star rating. The highest rating is five stars, which Dr. Jeffrey Zilberstein, medical director at Peconic Bay, said the center is striving for.



Increase for retired volunteers; taxpayers expect relief

Town passes eight ambulance district referendums

Town of Brookhaven residents voted to pass eight referendums on Aug. 9 for the special-use districts that fund the not-forprofit ambulance companies in the Town of Brookhaven to modify the existing Volunteer Benefit program known, as LOSAP that has not been changed since

The modification will now increase the amount of credit a volunteer receives for a year of service from \$20 to \$30, while dropping the eligibility age from 65 to 60. The program is also now being coupled with the recently adopted Revenue Recovery program, agreed to between the eight volunteer ambulance companies

and the Town of Brookhaven.

The amendment is applicable to only those who earn at least one year of service credit for calendar years beginning on Jan. 1, 2023. The monthly payment increases will be effective as of Jan. 1 the following year in the additional service credit was earned.

Local amendments include the South Country Ambulance District, Medford Ambulance District, Mastic Ambulance District, Mastic Beach Ambulance District, and the Shirley Ambulance District.

The current annual cost of funding the South Country's volunteer service award program is \$29,000. The new cost of the program, according to the town, will increase in 2023 to \$118,500 for current volunteers. The current annual cost of funding the Medford Ambulance District Volunteer Service Award Program is \$54,000. The increase will be as much as \$134,000 for current volunteers. The Mastic Beach Ambulance District Volunteer Service Award Program is \$26,500 to \$87,000; Shirley is \$29,000 to \$90,000; and Mastic is \$5,000 to \$43,000. However, the cost per town taxpayer depends on the individual district.

According to South Country Ambulance chief and district manager Greg Miglino, the vote is to modernize the volunteer retirement system known as LOSAP in the Town of Brookhaven ambulance districts. The current system, he said, has not been modified in 27 years and lags behind that of other volunteer

fire and EMS agencies a New York State.

"The program will now be totally funded out of money that would be generated by the implementation of the EMS Cost Recovery Act, passed in New York last year," he explained, noting it will also result in taxpayer savings. In the South Country Ambulance District, if approved, the increased cost for the modified program (if there was no Revenue Recovery Program) would be less the .2 cents a day or about \$6.27 increase for an entire year for the average taxpayer. Currently, South Country Ambulance volunteers are the busiest EMS agency in the Town of Brookhaven, handling almost 4,000 9-11 calls a year.

'They deserve what they are asking for, between the pandemic and the service they give," added vice chair of the Long Island Fire Fighters Legislative Committee, Bill Theis.




goes as far as he wants. He will be playing in college and if he keeps trending better, year after year like he has been, then the sky is the limit.'
