Sonnie steals the show!

EM local performs in 'Ragtime'

East Moriches' own Sonnie Betts, the 9-year-old and up-and-coming actress, recently appeared in Bay Street Theater's acclaimed production of "Ragtime." The show received rave reviews and ran through Aug. 28 at the Sag Harbor Center for the Arts.

Betts, a fourth-grade student at East Moriches, discovered her love for acting at the age of 4, and by the age of 6, she made her main stage debut at The Gateway Playhouse as Gretl in "The Sound of Music." Throughout her young career, Betts has performed in a wide variety of shows at both the Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Center and The Gateway Playhouse.

"It has been a complete pleasure working with Sonnie Betts on 'Ragtime.' She is an absolute natural onstage, always alive and never making a false move—a total pro at a pretty young age," the show's director, Will Pomerantz, said of Betts. "I never had to worry about her—she always knew her lines, music, and blocking. I

expect great things from her, should she decide to continue her work as a performer."

The actress has two younger brothers and parents who are in the gardening and technology fields. She is the only actress of the family. When asked about her daughter's early acting career, her mother, Gerilyn, said she believes it's her stamina that gets her roles.

"The show was incredible. The cast and everybody were nothing but welcoming to Sonnie; she learned so much," she said of her daughter's time on "Ragtime." "She was really incredible."

In "Ragtime," Betts played the little girl. The Tide conducted a Q&A with Betts:

TIDE: How did you get into acting? Betts: When I was in pre-school, I did a show and went onstage. I really loved it.

TIDE: How did you get the role?

Betts: I auditioned at 6 years old and it was cancelled because of COVID. I auditioned again and got a callback, but couldn't go because I was sick. But they still got in the show.

Ancient Order of Hibernians dedicate Mass rock

Clarke Homesite in Manorville

On Sept. 18, the Ancient Order of Hibernians joined the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians, local elected officials, and a Catholic priest to dedicate a Mass rock at the Thomas and Kathleen Daly Clarke Homesite in Manorville. A Mass followed the dedication, which honored the Clarkes' efforts in the fight for Irish independence as well as their devotion to practicing and preserving Catholicism.

'My brothers and sisters," Fr. Henry's dedication began, "today we gather together as God's holy people celebrating this 25th Sunday in ordinary time, and dedicating this holy altar, in honor of those who have given their lives for the faith, in honor of those who've gone before us, handing down their traditions."

Before the dedication, Ancient Order of Hibernians Suffolk County historian Joe Kelly provided the crowd before him with historical context for the Clarkes' journeys. He discussed the lasting impact of the Irish Penal Laws that began in 1695, which suppressed the Gaelic language, limited Catholics' right to property, and forced members of the Catholic clergy into hiding. This later effect is now remembered through dedicated Mass rocks, natural stones found in glens and desolate hillsides in Ireland, where priests were forced to practice their faith with their flock.

We're here, as we look forward, to



look back to a time when in native Ireland, the Irish were suppressed, the Roman Catholic [faith], the Gaelic language and the Irish culture," Brookhaven Town supervisor Ed Romaine said. "We're here to remember a group of people that would not go quietly into the night, that stood up and fought for their faith.

"We're here to remember, with this rock, all the rocks in the glens and woods of Ireland, that those who were faithful met, and with their priest, prayed their religion, spoke their language and remembered." he continued. "Today is a day of remembrance, where we remember what happened, and we celebrate our faith and our heritage."

Among those who kept Irish faith and culture alive were Thomas and Kathleen Dalv Clarke. In 1987, the Ancient Order of Hibernians uncovered the land deed verifying the Clarkes owned a 60-acre farm in Manorville from 1905 to 1907. The Ancient Order of Hibernians and the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians then erected an obelisk made of granite from County Wicklow, Ireland, on their farm in the Clarkes' honor.

Thomas Clarke was the lead signer on the 1916 Proclamation, which called for Irish independence from Britain, and was a critical figure in the Irish Republican Brotherhood and the 1916 Easter Rising. He, along with several other leaders, was executed following the mired uprising. While his efforts may have failed to free Ireland from British rule, they influenced years of perseverance through strife that would

engender Ireland as a nation.

Kathleen Daly Clarke was an influential figure in her own right, aiding in efforts for Irish independence. She also forged a political career for herself that culminated in her serving as the first female Lord Mayor of Dublin in 1939, a position she held until she retired in 1941. She died in 1972.

Past and current presidents of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians filled the crowd. Many of them spoke during the dedication and performed readings during the Mass, including Vic Vogel, a former president for the Ancient Order of Hibernians Suffolk County and New York State chapters. He discussed how the Mass rock came to be, 35 years after the initial marking of the Clarke Homesite.

"A few years ago, after the New York State board meeting in East Durham, [Fr. Henry] said Mass at the Mass rock in Green County, and that was such a successful event, such a moving event, I decided to make it a goal to get a Mass rock in Suffolk County," Vogel said. "Take a look around. I think in a few vears, we could make this site into a national park. We've just begun.'

Bill Gorham, the current president of the Suffolk County chapter, was thankful Vogel implored him to get a Mass rock in Manorville

"Vic came to me the first day—the first hour—I was president, and said he wanted me to do this," Gorham recalled. "We walked right over to Fr. Henry; he thought it was a great idea. And this is just fabulous for you to all come here and look at this now; it is such a site." ■

Third annual Keith Romaine Memorial Snapper Derby

Event raises \$1600 for Joseph Rera Memorial Scholarship Fund

A refreshing breeze from the Moriches Bay and community spirit imbued the families gathered at the Union Avenue Dock in Center Moriches on a Sunday afternoon.

The Town of Brookhaven hosted the third annual Keith Romaine Memorial Snapper Derby, Sept. 18 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Co-sponsored by the Montauk Surfcasters Association with support from the Chamber of Commerce of the Moriches, the friendly competition in honor of Romaine, the late son of Brookhaven supervisor Ed Romaine, has attracted support from families and friends throughout the community since its 2020 inception.

'All the kids have smiles on their faces, and that's the most important part," Brookhaven Town councilman Dan Panico said. "The fish are already jumping, so we'll see at the end of the day who comes out victorious.

"I have no doubt everyone's going to have a great time," he continued. "It's a great event for the memory of Joseph Rera, and this is named after my friend and councilman Keith Romaine, who used to fish off this very dock.'

Romaine died in 2009 at Winthrop University Hospital in Mineola, from complications brought on by a viral infection. He was 36.

This year, 79 children from Center Moriches and surrounding communities signed up for the catch-and-release tournament. In the 4 to 12 age group, Grace Scalezi came out on top with a 10-inch snapper. Nick Hristidis led the pack amongst the 12 and 1/2 to 18-yearolds with his 10-and-3/4-inch catch.

The third incarnation of the event in Romaine's name followed last year's efforts to honor another member of the Center Moriches community who died before his time: Joseph Rera. The 16-year-old died on Nov. 6, 2020, at Cupsogue Beach County Park in Westhampton Beach. Closure eluded his friends and family until his body was recovered on Dec. 4, 2020.

During and following this strife, the community rallied behind Rera's loved ones, donating \$28,996 to a GoFundMe page one of his friends formed to support the Rera family. The community doubled down to support an initiative another one of Rera's friends kicked off to renovate and establish a plaque at the Union Avenue Dock in his hon-

At this year's derby, families were asked to donate \$5 per child to the Joseph Rera Memorial Scholarship Fund. Parents were happy to both enjoy time with their families as the summer waned and support another.

"We're here donating to the Joseph Rera fund, a great cause," said Manorville native Kathleen Milano, cheering on her children Olivia Milano, 13, and Vincent Milano, 7, at the derby. "We didn't know him personally, but we followed his story. We know a lot of people in Center Moriches that knew him, so we wanted to come support him and his family."

In total, the event raised \$1,605 to the Joseph Rera Scholarship Fund. In addition to the funds raised from the community, the Montauk Surfcasters Association, which co-sponsors similar derbies across the island each summer season, stepped up with a major boost.

"We have a \$1000 check for the [Joseph Rera Foundation] scholarship," William Jakob, of the Montauk Surfcasters Association, said. "Last year we had just under \$1,000. It's all about helping the kids.'

Rera's enthusiasm for fishing, which he did often at the Union Avenue Dock, was felt at the event. Parents helped young children untangle and cast their lines and cheered them on as they reeled in their snappers. Many little ones, including 7-year-old Cole Reed, strained to peer over the railing to crank in their hauls.

'This is what they love to do," Lindsay Heinz, Reed's mother, of East Quogue, said, minutes before he caught his first snapper of the day. \blacksquare



CM resident petitions for rail station

LIRR doesn't plan to restore service

The Center Moriches train station was closed in 1998 as the Long Island Rail Road made upgrades to nearby stations at both Mastic-Shirley and Speonk to accommodate the new double-level diesel

Local resident Jerry Eaderesto was led to believe that the criteria for disconnecting their service was due to low daily ridership and that the distances to nearby stations were deemed as sufficient access.

The Mastic-Shirley station is approximately 4 miles west of Center Moriches and the Speonk station is approximately 6 miles east of Center Moriches.

According to MTA media liaison Dave Steckel, there is service to the Center Moriches area via the Montauk Branch, which offers 13 eastbound trains to/ from Mastic-Shirley and 15 eastbound

trains to/from Speonk daily and 14 trains to/from both stations going west. However, according to Eaderesto, there is frequently heavy traffic on the roads to the Mastic station and the buses take an hour-long route from the Mastic station to Center Moriches.

"The distance between our town and either Speonk or Mastic is neither walkable or easy," he said of the challenge. "Cabs from both stations are infrequent, expensive, and unreliable."

Since the '90s, when the station closed, Eaderesto said there were two major petitions sent to the MTA requesting the resumption of service Additionally, Eaderesto said that since the closure, there has been a significant population

increase in the Moriches and Manorville area. Also, Brookhaven Town sent a study to the LIRR that underscored the local population growth.

According to the Town of Brookhaven's 2016 Moriches, Center Moriches, East Moriches and Eastport Montauk Highway Corridor recommendations, while not part of the study, the town, at that time, was actively working to determine if it was feasible to reopen a train station to encourage the use of buses and trains to reduce on-road traffic.

"After speaking to the head of external affairs for the LIRR, it's clear that the LIRR has allocated no funding and has no plans to reopen the station in the foreseeable future," said councilman Dan Panico.


As per 1990 New York census data, there were just under 6,000 residents in Center Moriches near the time of the train station closure. As of 2020, according to census data, the area now has just under 8,000 residents. ■


