
Moriches is a 2.3-square-mile hamlet (part of the tri-hamlet of the Mastics, Moriches, and Shirley) and is located in Suffolk County, on the South Shore of Long Island. The name "Moriches" comes from Meritces, a Native American who owned land on Moriches Neck.

According to Century 21 Cor-Ace Realty brokers and owners Tony and Barbara Liberti, the Moriches is a great place to live, with an urban and suburban mix.

"Quiet and serene," Tony Liberti said. "We are surrounded by nature—parks and preserves, ocean beaches. It has some great local places to eat and shop, and one of the best diners on the island: The Moriches Bay Diner."

High school security guard and retired sheriff honored

Lifelong Center Moriches resident, sheriff, and Center Moriches High School security guard, Joseph Townsend, was selected as this year's St. Patrick's Day parade grand marshal.


"It's an honor because I have lived in this town all my life," he said, excited for the big day. Townsend, 78, is known for giving back to his community and loving his family. He is an Irishman, though he is more known for his Irish heritage from his wife, Patricia Townsend, who served as a Christmas parade judge; she died about three years ago. Patricia, a Bellport native, summered in the Moriches, where they met boating. They were married for 51 years. Together they had two daughters, Sandi, surname Dennis, and Sarah, surname Davis. "She was the Irish one in the fami-

ly. We always followed along with the things she did, like green carnations and Irish soda bread contests," said Sandi.

Sandi is a paraprofessional in the Center Moriches School District. She and her husband, Tom, have two children, Molly, 17, and Isabel, 11. Sarah and her husband, Alan, both went to Center Moriches High School and have one child named Andrew, 6. Both families stayed in Center Moriches, living only blocks away from Townsend, who still lives in the family home he built in 1976 on Bellevue Avenue.

es and graduated from the high school in 1962. By 1967, he was hired by the Suffolk County Sheriff's Department, where he retired as deputy sheriff investigator in 1995. During his time with the Sheriff's Department, he held the title of president of the deputy sheriff investigator association for five years. He was also honored as Police Officer of The Year in 1984.

Townsend is also an active member of the Center Moriches Fire Department, which he joined in 1965. He also served as chief of the department from 1971 to 1978 and was honored as Fireman of The Year in 1991. In 1981, he was elected to the fire department's board of commissioners, where he served for 25 years, 10 as chairman.

In 1996, he joined the Center Moriches High School as a security guard. In 2007, he was appointed coordinator. In 2021, he stepped down from that position, but continued as a security guard. A proud alum of the school, he has attended the prom for the past 25 years, including for both his daughters and his two granddaughters.

Townsend said he has had a great life and is proud to live in such a great community surrounded by so many friends and family. According to his daughter Sandi, his entire family is proud of him and plans to attend the party and the parade, then continue to celebrate him after.

Ahead of the parade, Townsend will be celebrated on Friday, March 10 at the St. Patrick Parade Party at Rock Hill Country Club, from 7 to 11 p.m. ■

As for Moriches Bay Realty, broker/ owner Gerry Saponara, she has been living in the area since 1957 and said it's her knowledge about the details of the area that makes her service special. Most people, she said, come to the area because of the waterfronts and soon discover the newly renovated public library and learn to treasure the history-rich marinas.

According to Cor-Ace Realty, house styles and sizes vary throughout Moriches area, including capes, ranches, colonials, Victorians, post-modern/contemporary, from 1,100 square feet to 2,900 square feet. Moriches is part of the award-winning William Floyd School District. In the broader sense of the area, Saponara said that general-sized Moriches homes are anywhere from 1,000-2,500 square feet, with the larger homes in neighboring Manorville. Luxury homes up to 6,000 square feet are also available in the Moriches.

As of February, there were seven homes on the market in the town of Moriches, with prices ranging from \$459,000 to \$895,000 and taxes ranging from \$4,440.70 (55-plus condos in The Waterways) to \$18,835.17. The average sale price of a home in Moriches was \$660,000 last month, up 35.3 percent since last year. If considering the Moriches area in whole, including Center and East Moriches as well, a total of 46 homes and land for sale were found listed from \$5 million to \$459,000. The rental market is also in high demand, though very scarce.

Center Moriches joins sustainable library program

Saving taxpayer dollars and the environment

The Center Moriches Free Public Library recently joined the sustainable library initiative supporting their environmental efforts as well as saving taxpayer dollars. Library director Marcie Litjens said the library was happy to hop on the initiative and eager to get a committee started.

"It's not just looking at energy efficiency," said Litjens, "it's also a commitment to the library getting the best value for what we do."

The Center Moriches sustainability committee comprises staff members from various departments, including: Dominique Nason, Children's Department; Jessica Ceramello, head of Teen Services; Christie Matheson, librarian I, Reference Department; Mary McNulty, librarian II, Reference Department; Robert Chesnut, assistant director; and Litjens, library director.

"Within the last several years, the Board of Trustees has embarked on several projects that have increased the efficiency of our library, such as replacing windows original to the building, retrofitting to LED lighting, and most recently converting to natural gas from oil," Litjens said.

Last October, after a presentation about the Sustainable Libraries Initiative, the board agreed that it would be a long-term commitment that both their community and staff will benefit from.

The Sustainable Libraries Initiative is a nationwide organization with over 75

public libraries currently enrolled in the Sustainable Libraries Certification Program. With categories of actions focusing on each of the three pillars of triple bottom line (Environmentally Sound, Socially Equitable, and Economically Feasible) sustainability such as Energy, Indoor Spaces, Social Cohesion, and Resilience Planning, this comprehensive process leads a library toward institutional change that shifts the rationale for every decision to consider the local and global impacts.

Through the program, libraries work with their communities to listen and learn, allowing local needs to be identified and addressed. Strengthening the relationship between the library and the community they serve builds resilience through stronger connections with many organizations and increased access to information. The path to certification through the Sustainable Libraries Certification Program is flexible for libraries of different types, sizes, and budgets and guided by the communities they serve. Each library that completes the program will select the benchmarks that best fit the needs of their library and community, resulting in a uniquely sustainable organization.


The mission is to empower library leaders to advance environmentally sound, socially equitable, and economically feasible practices to intentionally address climate change and co-create thriving communities. The program has collectively offset the equivalent of 8.15 million letter pages of paper consumption by reforesting 977.88 trees since joining PrintReleaf in August 2021.

According to Roger Reyes, assistant director of the Suffolk County Cooperative Library System and co-creator of the Sustainable Libraries Initiative, "The Center Moriches Library has demonstrated a commitment to sustainability at an impressive level. They are early adopters of this work in the field and in their community and are helping lead the way to create a vibrant, future-focused library that is contributing to community resilience both locally and globally."

The Sustainable Library Certification Program and the SLI community of practice focuses on the individual library's leadership to enable them. To become certified, the library must first survey their stakeholders and form a sustainability team. That team then takes a closer look at how things are done and/or consumed at the library. They then think about how to proceed differently with tips from the initiative. Finally, a presentation is required to both summarize the work done for the evaluation team as well as to assist the team in spreading the word locally. The certification process typically takes 18 to 24 months to complete.

As the Center Moriches team learns more and delves further into the certification process, Litjens said that they will include additional staff members to help promote, support, and achieve the goals of the initiative. Currently, the library is working on energy and waste audits. They are also planning a sustainability celebration on Earth Day that will focus on their organic, non-GMO seed library, home gardening and crafts and displays. The celebration will take place on Saturday, April 22 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

All-girls flag football league launches

East End Athletics opens registration

As a first of its kind in the area, Ali Adlah, president of PAL CM Red Devils football, has plans to create an all-girls flag football league. And as if the launch of the league for girls isn't enough, Adlah will also be starting a Superstar League. which will include free registration for all children with special needs.

"There isn't anything for them until high school," said Adlah of his thinking.

East End Athletics Inc. is a not-forprofit sports organization that just started in January 2023. They will provide opportunities for all ages and abilities, including children and athletes with special needs. The Superstar League, which is a free league, was created for athletes with special needs and also gives them an opportunity to play organized sports.

'This will give everyone an opportunity to play flag football close to home and not have to travel up island," explained Adlah, excited to get started. "This league is meant to open up opportunity for all to play, without breaking the bank.'

Members of the board consist of an occupational therapist, special education teacher, parents of children with special needs, and football enthusiasts. The league also has a kids' board, which has the same responsibilities as the adult board.

"They have to plan programs for the organization, budget their finances, and make decisions about the future of the organization," he said of the inclusive nature of the league. "Who better to get ideas for an organization children play in than children themselves?"

Registration is now open and the first spring league will start in March. Currently, Adlah is seeking neighboring town parks and recreations to secure fields on the East End of Long Island to conduct practices, games, and tournaments. Once a field is secured as their home base, they will begin accepting donations to help keep the league affordable

Additionally, the league reached out to Center Moriches Schools' athletic director, Jeremy Thode, to possibly help build a mentor program with their girls flag football team.

'We are looking for investors and sponsors to help us build a state-of-theart sports complex for programs such as ours," Adlah added. "But without an indoor facility and/or a home base field, it's proving difficult to row these leagues. Donations are greatly appreciated in hopes of building our very own state-of-the-art sports complex to house our flag football league and other sports to come.

Their philosophy is giving opportunities to play instead of focusing on just winning. Within the league, players don't have to try out; they just have to register. He hopes the new venture will get kids out playing sports, building peer relationships and fostering a love of sports.

"But most of all," he said, "is to get them to be more active and part of organized sports, rather than sitting watching social media and in front of a screen."







During Joe's career in the Sheriff's Dept. he was chosen as Officer Of The Year and for five years was the president of the Deputy Sheriff Investigator's Association. Joe retired from the Department in 1995 and in the following year started a second career providing security for the Center Moriches School District.

During his time with the School District, he became the Coordinator and Supervisor of Security. He stepped down from that position just a couple of years ago but remains with the District still ensuring the safety of our students.

Joe continues to be an active member of the Fire Dept.

Joe and Pat were married for 51 years before Pat's passing a few years ago. During their long marriage Joe and Pat enjoyed their time together and their life in a community of "really great people".
